At least one should be in the form of a test in the lines of the End Semester Examination and the other two assessments can be in the form of assignments, drawing plates, models, etc.

The total marks obtained in all the assessments put together out of 300, shall be reduced to a weightage of 50 marks and rounded to nearest integer.

The University examinations for Theory cum Studio courses will be of 3 hours duration and shall normally conducted between October and December during the odd semesters and between April and June during the even semesters. If a student has failed (vide clause 10.1) in a theory cum studio course, the continuous assessment marks the student has earned is no longer valid. The student on doing reappearance registration has to appear for the assessments along with the current batch of students and earn continuous assessment marks again.

9.3 Assessment for Theory Cum Studio Courses

The maximum marks for continuous Assessment shall be 50 in case of theory cum studio courses. Three assessments for theory cum studio courses, each carrying 100 marks shall be conducted by the Department. At least one should be in the form of a test in the lines of the End Semester Examination and the other two assessments can be in the form of assignments, drawing plates, models, etc.

The total marks obtained in all the assessments put together out of 300, shall be reduced to a weightage of 50 marks and rounded to nearest integer.

The University examinations for Theory cum Studio courses will be of 3 hours duration and shall normally be conducted between October and December during the odd semesters and between April and June during the even semesters. If a student has failed (vide clause 10.1) in a theory cum studio course, the continuous assessment marks is valid only for the first arrear attempt and for the subsequent arrear attempts the end semester marks alone is to be considered for the grading.
